IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Minister by sections 49 and 82 of [the Uganda Citizenship and Immigration Control Act](#) and, in consultation, with the National Citizenship and Immigration Board, these Regulations are made this 27th day of January, 2021.

1. Title

These Regulations may be cited as the Uganda Citizenship and Immigration Control (Fees) Regulations, 2021.

2. Fees

The fees specified in the [Schedule](#) to these Regulations shall be the fees payable for the matters specified in the [Schedule](#).

3. Waiver of fees

The fees specified in Part II of the [Schedule](#) to these Regulations, relating to work permits shall not apply—

- (a) to a national of Rwanda or Kenya; or
- (b) to a refugee who is gainfully employed.

4. Revocation of S.I No. 13 of 2016, S.I No. 52 of 2016 and S.I No. 49 of 2018

The following Regulations are revoked—

- (a) the Uganda Citizenship and Immigration Control (Fees) Regulations, 2016;
- (b) the Uganda Citizenship and Immigration Control (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations, 2016; and
- (c) the Uganda Citizenship and Immigration Control (Fees) (Amendment) Regulations, 2018.
