## Uganda Tea Authority (Repeal) Act Chapter 45

**An Act to repeal the Uganda Tea Authority Act, Cap. 36 (Revised Edition, 2000); to provide for the appointment of a liquidator for the purpose of dissolving the Uganda Tea Authority and for related matters.**

*[Act 10/2006]*

### 1. Interpretation

In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

“**Authority**” means the Uganda Tea Authority established under the Uganda Tea Authority Act, Cap. 36 (Revised Edition, 2000);

“**Minister**” means the Minister responsible for agriculture.

### 2. Appointment of liquidator

- (1) The Minister shall, on the coming into force of this Act, appoint a liquidator to dissolve the Authority.
- (2) The liquidator appointed under subsection (1), shall be appointed on such terms and conditions as the Minister may determine in the instrument of appointment.

### 3. Duties of liquidator

The duties of the liquidator shall be to—

- (a) receive all the assets of the Authority;
- (b) receive and settle any claim relating to any obligation of the Authority;
- (c) determine and settle the terminal benefits payable to the former employees of the Authority;
- (d) dispose of the assets of the Authority;
- (e) recover any debts owed to the Authority;
- (f) carry out any other duty which is incidental or related to the foregoing duties.

### 4. Repeal

The Uganda Tea Authority Act, Cap. 36 (Revised Edition, 2000) is repealed.
